Treasurer's Report

Operating account balance - \$76,245.64

This is a very healthy balance (current cash position in the operating account) which is reflective of the of a past surplus (\$30k-ish) and a healthy amount of 2025 pledges already received and paid in full.

Total expenses for January were only \$8516.55

Savings/Money Market balance - \$136,674.31

This is the healthy cash position that I discussed with Amanda, Dena, and Bill. This could be construed as a "rainy day fund" should we need any major repairs or consider operating at a deficit for a short time should we choose to pursue a full time rector.

Pledges Received as of January 31, 2025 - \$37,145 or 16% of the pledge total for 2025. If one were to evenly spread out pledges contributions per month we would take in about 8% of the pledge value, so this is really good news that we are sitting on double the amount of expected pledges received to date.

Interim Rector's report

Annual Parish Meeting took place on January 12. After reports were given, we thanked the outgoing vestry members, Carol VanVoorhis and Peggy Wilson; outgoing treasurer, Sam Shiver; outgoing finance chair, Peggy Barnes; outgoing LCF chair, John Graeter; and outgoing senior warden, Gail Kase. The following people were commissioned for new ministries: vestry – Keith Pierce, Jennifer Reda, Ron Pell; senior warden, Amanda Hilty; junior warden, Ron Pell; treasurer, Marcus King.

Vestry Mini-Retreat took place on Saturday, February 1, 9 am to 12 noon. We reflected on what it means to be Church through scripture and our own experiences. We reviewed the structure and governance of The Episcopal Church, the Diocese of WNC, and our parish. I presented a revised layout of Ministry Leadership at Holy Spirit. Our vestry liaisons have been assigned according to the committees at Holy Spirit. I recommended that we broaden the vestry roles to include ministry areas. We will review this further at our upcoming vestry meeting.

Worship

Sunday worship in this season after Epiphany, January and February, has had the theme of the ways God has been made known through Jesus. I have attempted to address the current political unrest in my preaching, focusing on who we are called to be as Church in difficult times. I continue to lead the Vespers service at Mars Hill Manor on the second Sunday each month.

Holy Spirit has been gifted a set of fourteen Stations of the Cross, made of wood and pewter. We will dedicate them on Sunday March 2. They are a gift from the Diocese of Northern Indiana through Brother John Huebner who will be our guest on March 2.

Pastoral

Starr O'Hara and her daughter, Raven, will continue in our prayers. Gail Kase is overseeing a

meal ministry, in which Starr comes by the church and gets prepared meals left in the freezer. I Martie Carson is progressing through her chemo treatments, which should end mid-April. Surgery will follow. Trusting that all goes well, Martie hopes to return as our Admin Assistant once she has recovered from surgery. This has been a particularly rough cold and flu season for our congregation, with continued outbreaks of Covid.

Formation and Fellowship

The theme for our Wednesday Lenten Program will be Stories and Fellowship with our Latina/Latino Neighbors, facilitated by Rebecca Sharp. The dates are March 12, 19, 26, and April 2 and 9. Friends from La Esperanza will join us to share our meal at 6:00 and program at 6:30. On April 9, our last Lenten Wednesday, the Church calendar date when we remember Dietrich Bonhoeffer, we will collect all we have gathered into Evening Prayer followed by our meal.

Beginning on Sunday March 2, I will begin offering what we'll call Sermon Dialogue for a short discussion about the sermon and reading following the worship service on Sundays. Administrative

Martie and I have worked together to produce a list of duties for admin volunteers while she is in treatment. Martie will work when she is able and the team will cover for her when she can't.

I was away in January from the 21 through the 27. Dennis Fortinos served as supply priest on January 26. I will be away to officiate at a wedding in Charleston March 28-30. Dennis Fortinos will serve as supply on Sunday, March 30.

Sadly, no submissions for our Rector position were received. (Take a moment . . .) Joslyn Schaefer, our diocesan facilitator, relayed Canon Augusta's message that this is not abnormal. Joslyn told us of at least 6 churches that had no responses for their first rounds of advertising.

Even though it was agreed that posting the ad for another 4 week round is a good idea, it was also agreed that we should pause to gather ourselves and research possible reasons for the lack of responses.

Possibilities include:

- 1. Full time vs. part time. Do we have the capacity to offer a full time salary?
- 2. Stewardship education could help increase our budget, but it is a longer term solution. Other concerns:
- 1. Dena's expectations for the length of her term.

2. If we are looking at a significantly longer period of time until we have a new rector, does it make sense to consider another interim sooner rather than later?

For now: Vestry's responsibility is to stay strong and optimistic and to trust in the Spirit-led process.
